## “Senseless Violence In a Sinful World”

Last Sunday, our congregation was blessed through the preaching and testimony of Pastor Steve Beason, chaplain for the Las Vegas Police department. Steve shared what God has been doing through the recent, horrible tragedy in Las Vegas. Across our nation, people have been dumbfounded and shocked by the inexplicable shootings of 568 innocent people in Las Vegas on October 1, and 46 worshipers this past Sunday at the First Baptist Church in Sutherland Springs, Texas.

For some people these tragedies turn into referendums on gun control, political party failures, and the efficacy of prayer. In today's CONNECT, I simply want to focus on these events from a spiritual viewpoint. Tragedies like these cause us to think about what we truly believe about God. Why didn't God protect those innocent people? If anyone should have received a little extra protection, shouldn't it have been people sitting in church worshipping? Does this mean God didn't know, or care, or couldn't prevent the massacre? Absolutely not! These senseless tragedies remind us of the utter brokenness of our world and the greater, wonderful plan that God has for His creation.

As you look through the Bible, you find that God's servants were never immune from the devastating effects of sin in the world. Read Hebrews 11:35-40 for a recounting of the pain, misery, rejection, destitution, torture, and imprisonment which God's children have endured. We must mourn with those who mourn, because for every person who died there are dozens who are still grieving today. We must pray for a world caught in the quagmire of sin in multiple forms of hate, injustice, and violence.

For what we Christians offer to this world, above all else, is the hope of Jesus Christ! The reason those people were in church Sunday in Sutherland Springs was because they believed in something greater than themselves. They believed in a place greater than this world and a purpose more important than their own lives. They believed Jesus came to earth and died so that they could live eternally. They believed they would go to Heaven, though none expected it would be so soon. The people in that church were protected from life's ultimate consequences of eternal death. Now they are in a place where there is no more pain, no more tears, and no more sin (Romans 8:37-39).

So grieve, rejoice, comfort the hurting, call your congress person, pray, and be reminded of the eternal truth of Jesus Christ. Sin has infected this world. That's why we need Jesus Christ so desperately!
